

WERA-LP FM 96.7 Programming Application

WERA is a non-profit, non-commercial, FCC-licensed low power FM station, and a project of Arlington Community Access Corporation, dba, Arlington Independent Media (AIM).

AIM supports, educates, and inspires diverse creators and fosters independent media production through community television, radio, and digital arts.

Our station's official mission is "to enlighten, enrich, and entertain Arlington's diverse community by promoting and facilitating independent radio production."

We accept and review applications to create programs of local interest to the community of and by those who live and work in the DMV listening area two times a year, January and July.

Program Content

We are looking for programs that will fulfill our ideals of:

- Service
- Enrichment
- Localism

- Diversity
- Innovation
- Community

We are seeking proposals for news, arts and culture, music, and interview and talk shows. They can be live in-studio, live on-site, or pre-recorded programs.

Our preference is for weekly re-occurring half-hour to one-hour programs, but we also want to encourage some longer or shorter series, limited duration series, and one-off documentaries and features. AIM's audio production studio can accommodate small musical, comedic, and dramatic performances as well as four-person panel discussions or interviews. The WERA on-air control room is large enough to conduct one-on-one interviews, phone-in talk shows, DJ shows, and the like.

Program Producers

Program producers will control the content of their programs and will not have to adhere to a centralized format.

Only non-commercial programming is permitted. Underwriting the production costs of your program may be proposed, but must follow strict AIM guidelines (contact AIM staff for more information).

Program producers **must** be or become AIM members and will be **required** to take appropriate AIM training. Workshops, schedules, and fees are found under "Training" on the AIM web site, arlingtonmedia.org, or by calling 703-524-2388.

As a producer, you will also be responsible for knowing about relevant Federal Communications Commission (FCC) regulations and music licensing requirements. (This will be included in training sessions once your initial proposal is accepted.)



Application Process

Complete the application and submit it by email to wera-programming@arlingtonmedia.org with "WERA Program Application" in the subject line. Or you may mail or deliver your application to:

Staff will review your application based on the values and requirements discussed above. You may be contacted to arrange a phone or in-person conversation (optional, but helpful: Submit an audio sample of your program or idea (five minutes maximum)).

Applications will be accepted twice a year, January and July. We will make every effort to notify you of your proposal status in a timely manner.

Accepted Programming

If your program is accepted, AIM staff will work with you to finalize details of your show's duration, time slot, and production needs.

Producers shall sign an agreement detailing expectations and responsibilities. For all content providers, a signed agreement will set the minimum expectation for number and length of your programs. (For example: one hour weekly for six months; a six-episode limited series; one-time-only show, etc.)

Please understand that these procedures and rules may be subject to change. We will publicize changes and calls for applications on our website, social media, and mailing list. We are open to your suggestions and comments. Email us using the subject line "WERA Comments" at wera-programming@arlingtonmedia.org.
